The Lodge is situated in a 3,100-acre state park that is a wonderful family vacation destination. We're receiving a discounted rate on a block of guestrooms in the Lodge and nearby Cottages. Campsites (where pets are welcome) are also nearby but no special pricing is available. The Lodge meets ADA specifications and several guestrooms have roll-in showers. Elevators are available on each floor; including the Mezzanine where we will be dining. And, there will be deaf interpreters available, if needed.

We are working to make this Annual Conference accessible to all CDC members and guests. A limited number of scholarships are available to offset registration fees and related expenses. Other amenities include trails for hikers, bicyclists, and equestrians. Serious golfers can enjoy the 350-acre golf course but there's also a separate disc golf course, putt-putt golf course, and playgrounds for kids of all ages. If you're interested in playing competitive, heart-pounding games in your leisure time, there are lighted courts for tennis, volleyball, basketball, and shuffleboard. Best of all, if you just need a chance to relax and unwind with friends and sisters in Christ, there is a nice beach on the east bank of the lake and the Lodge features both an indoor and outdoor pool. TRAVEL INFORMATION

Port Columbus International Airport is the closest hub and is usually the least expensive. We have volunteers who are willing to help shuttle attendees to and from the Lodge. The one-way trip takes approximately an hour. Please provide us with your travel itinerary as soon as possible.

Dayton International Airport is approximately an hour and twenty minutes away without traffic. Attendees who fly into Dayton should plan to rent a car for the remainder of the trip to the Lodge.

I-71 traverses Ohio from Northeast to Southwest. From I-71 take Exit 94: US-62; travel time to the Lodge from Exit 94 is approximately 20 miles and takes about 30 minutes. There's plenty of free, convenient parking at the Lodge.

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CHILD CARE REGISTRATION

Child Care is available and will be provided by a reliable and caring group of high-school aged teens (2 boys, 2 girls) who will be raising funds for the National Youth Gathering and local service projects. Please pre-register your children so we can plan appropriate activities for their age and interests. There will be a room where babies and younger children can play and be cared for, and where older children can have a nap or quiet time with an appropriate movie. In addition, the youth are planning to lead hikes and outdoor games like baseball and basketball. There is an outdoor swimming pool on the grounds with a life guard on-duty. The youth may supervise small groups at the pool; weather permitting. Parents are asked to pack lunches and snacks for their children (if they are not on the meal plan). There is a refrigerator available in the room.
